A Taste of Malawi: Futali

Ingredients:

1 small or 1 can of pumpkin 300g peanut flour* 700ml water Salt, to taste

Method:

Cut the pumpkin into pieces and add to a pot with the water and salt. Bring to a boil and cook until pumpkin is tender. Add the peanut flour and bring to a boil while constantly stirring. Reduce heat and simmer for 10 minutes. Mash or use an immersion blender to blend to a



smooth consistency. Serve on its own, as a side dish, or with Nsima (Sept 2014). *Peanut flour can be hard to find, a substitute is to grind 1/3 flour with 2/3 unsalted peanuts being careful to grind just until peanuts are ground but mixture is still crumbly.
