Heavy Rains Cause Flooding in Malawi

Malawi has been experiencing catastrophic flash floods due to unusually heavy rains; this has resulted in a state of emergency being declared. According to the Malawian government at least 48 people have died and an estimated 100 000 people have been displaced, but the children and staff at Chikondi are safe. The United Nations is in Malawi assessing the damage and needs, and will be distributing aid as the flood waters recede. The heavy rains that have caused these floods are expected to continue until the end of the month. We will update you next month on the situation.



Education Scholarship Fund

Chikondi will be launching our Education Scholarship Fund this year with a goal of providing a post-secondary education to all of the children at Chikondi. One of Chikondi's orphans, Peter Shaba, has already started pursuing a post-secondary education. Our goal is to raise the funds he needs to complete his Accounting Degree. Peter has been an orphan since age 4. He was left for dead and suffering from severe malnutrition when he was brought to the orphanage that our Head Mistress, Edass Ngwira, worked at; and she was the one

who nursed him back to health. She is the only support that Peter has, so he moved with her to Chikondi when it was founded in 2012. He is a hard-working, determined student who earns excellent grades. He has already completed 2 of the 12 semesters required to earn his degree at the Institute of Chartered Accountants in Malawi. We hope that with your help he will be able to earn his degree and secure a bright future that will help lift him out of the circle of poverty faced by many orphans. Ingredients:

1 Cup white rice½ Cup raisins1 Tbsp. brown sugar½ Tsp. cinnamon1 Tsp. salt1 Tbsp. ground turmeric2 Cups water2



Method:

Put all the ingredients together in one pot, bring to a boil then reduce to a simmer and cover pot. Cook gently for about 25 minutes, or until the rice is ready and the mixture is almost dry. Fluff the rice and serve in a warmed bowl.
