## Meet Paul and Jennifer, Two of Chikondi's Children

Paul and Jennifer are siblings. We met Paul when he was two years old. His spine had not developed properly and he was so fragile that he was unable to stand or walk. Their mother had died and their father was struggling to feed and care for both of them. Their father contacted us; he knew his son was so sick that he would die without intervention. Paul was so malnourished that we did not think he would survive the night. However, Edass, our head matron, was convinced that with food, love, kindness and prayer he would make it, and she was right. Slowly and with proper



nutrition Paul has grown strong. When Paul came to the orphanage his older sister Jennifer was distraught. Their father, who knew that Paul needed the care that only the orphanage could provide, knew that they needed to stay together so he made the difficult decision to have them both live at the orphanage. He often comes to visit his two beautiful children and



hopes and prays for the day he'll be able to provide for them and take them home. Words cannot express how grateful he is that we were able to save his son's life and that we've been able to give both his children a loving home, food, access to medical care and an education. Jennifer is thriving at the orphanage and is so happy that she can live with her brother. She is a sweet little girl who loves to play with dolls and spends a lot of her time with Fidess and Shakila. It's because of your continued support that we are able to provide lifesaving food and medical care to children who would die without it. You make the difference, zikomo (thank you)!

## A Taste of Malawi: Nthochi (banana) Bread

#### **Ingredients:**

1/2 cup margarine or shortening or butter
1 cup sugar
2 cups flour
1 egg
1 cup milk
1 tsp. baking powder
1 tsp. salt
5 small ripe bananas, mashed



#### **Method:**

Preheat oven to 325°F. Cream margarine/shortening/butter together with sugar then beat in egg. Add flour, salt, baking powder, milk, and bananas. Mix well to form batter and pour into greased loaf pan and bake for 90 minutes or until a toothpick comes out clean.
