### A Taste of Malawi: Stewed Red Beans

#### Ingredients:

4 cups of red beans  
2 cloves of garlic  
8 cups of water  
½ white onion  
1 tsp salt  
2 tomatoes



#### Method:

In a large pot add red beans, water and salt then bring to a boil. As the water boils down add more water to keep the beans covered. Turn the heat to low and boil until the beans are tender. Then add minced garlic, chopped onion and tomatoes, cook until the water turns into a creamy and smooth sauce.

Malawi grows 28 varieties of beans that are considered a staple food; therefore, there are a great variety of bean dishes.

Edass is an amazing woman with a true passion for her work with children. She keeps Chikondi running smoothly and is the children's primary caregiver. She has been with Chikondi since it was founded in 2012, moving from Lilongwe to Blantyre to do so. She had worked in Lilongwe for 11 years as a nanny to 69 children at another orphanage. The best part of her position at Chikondi is that her four children finally have the opportunity to live with her. Previously her children had been living at her sister's house because at her last job she was required to live at the orphanage and her children were not allowed to stay with her; a sacrifice she had to make because her job was necessary

to support them. Her children are instrumental in helping with the day-to-day activities at Chikondi like washing, cooking, cleaning and helping the younger children with their school work. She and her children feel so thankful to finally get to live together as a family. She is grateful to the Lihala's for providing the opportunities they have for her, her children and the children of Chikondi.
